Search And Rescue EXercise (SAREX), Saturday, August 19, Aurora:

Our last programmed SAREX of the year will be Saturday Aug 19, two days before the solar eclipse. There are other activities happening at the same time! We will be flying daily sorties to survey road and airport conditions for the Oregon Department of Aviation between Friday Aug 18 and Tuesday Aug 22. These sorties will also be flown on Saturday, affecting plans at Aurora and Redmond. Also that day we will be participating in a multi-wing, multi-region communications exercise to practice mission management using all our radio resources.

So we will break the SAREX itself into three more or less independent components: Communications, Eclipse Survey flights, and basic training. Lt.Col. Ira Rosenberg will be the IC at Aurora base, and we will also work from staging areas at Redmond and Medford. If you plan to attend, please sign up using the SignUp Genius link below:

Glider Orientation Rides, September 2-3, Prineville, OR. Maj Ireson's announcement follows. **Quick action on your part is necessary to get a spot.**

I am happy to confirm that we will be able to hold a glider O-ride weekend again this year. The earlier uncertainty regarding the availability of gliders has been resolved, and we will again have two gliders and other powered aircraft for O-rides on Labor Day weekend, at Prineville airport. Flights will take place on Saturday and Sunday, Sept 2 and 3.

We expect that we will again be able to camp out in the Prineville EAA hangar as in the past, and that the EAA chapter will provide breakfasts and lunches for a nominal cost. For cadets planning on glider rides, there will be a \$20 participation fee to offset organizational expenses.

Participation will be limited in order for everyone attending to have the ability to take one glider ride each day they are present. If you want to register, contact Capt. Great Start and NCO School, Saturday - Sunday, 14 - 15 October, at Aurora. Aurora Squadron will host the 3rd Annual Oregon Wing Great Start Weekend and NCO School. Applications for instructors are now being accepted:

The 3rd Annual Oregon Wing Great Start Weekend and NCO School is now accepting staff/instructor applications. The activity will be held at the Aurora Composite Squadron meeting hangar at Willamette Aviation Services, Aurora, Oregon, from Saturday, 14 October 2017 to Sunday, 15 October 2017. The activity cost will be \$25.00 dollars, which includes supplies, meals, and lodging.

Instructors should be Achievement 7 or 8 (C/CMSgt) at the time of the activity. They must be able to communicate digitally before the event to prepare classes and activities. Most of the curriculum is

already made, however some adjustments are necessary. Instructors must have prior student experience at an encampment or an NCOS.

To apply, complete a CAP resume as well as a cover letter in memorandum format that includes the following:

- 1. Which school (Great Start or NCOS) would you rather instruct and why?*
- 2. What are your leadership strengths? What can you bring to the position that others can't*
- 3. What traits do you look for in an instructor?*
